

NEW for 2019:

Shotgun - Participants should bring their own shotgun ammunition to the 2019 state event. A limited amount of FIOCCHI 12 and 20 gauge ammunition will be available while supplies last. Ammo may also be purchased at the shotgun shack: \$8/box for 12 or 20 gauge, \$12/box for 28 or .410.

- The ammunition must be new factory shells in the original manufacturer's box labeled with the participant's name.
- **NO RELOADS ALLOWED**
- Shells can be no more than 2 ¾ inches with a 3 dram equivalent and 1 1/8 oz of shot., The shot shall be lead and the size must be #7.5 or smaller. No steel shot allowed.
- Ammunition must be submitted during registration then moved by the MYHEC staff to the event director for inspection prior to the event.
- **It is the coach's responsibility to make sure their participants ammunition meets these guidelines and that they have enough rounds to complete the event. (suggest bringing two boxes)**
- If a participant's ammo fails the inspection, a limited amount of FIOCCHI 12 and 20 gauge ammunition will be available while supplies last. Ammo can also be purchased in the shotgun shack.
- The event director has the final decision on the ammunition inspection.
- Follow this procedure when submitting your shotgun ammunition for inspection.
 - Each box of ammunition is to be labeled with participant's name. (Figure 1)
 - DO NOT cover up the recipe of the ammunition when applying label. (Figure 2)
 - Coach is to collect shotgun ammunition from ALL team members and submit in ONE box when registering on Saturday morning of the event.
 - Shotgun Event Director will inspect ammunition before shooting the course.
- Follow this procedure when participating in the shotgun event.
 - Teams are to arrive at the shotgun event.
 - The box of inspected ammunition will be given to the designated team coach to transport from station to station.
 - *At each station the coach will remove the box of ammunition for the participant shooting and give it to the MYHEC range officer – individual rounds will then be handed to participants by the range officer as in the past.
 - *The unused portion of the box is to be returned to the coach to be placed in the team box.
 - The last two steps (marked with *) will be repeated at each station until all team members have completed the course.
- Once all team members have completed the course and score cards are turned in to event register, **it is the coach's responsibility to secure the ammunition in a location that is NOT accessible to unauthorized persons.**

- Any participant and/or coach that is intentionally trying to use the wrong ammunition or being unethical will be disqualified and possibly dismissed from the entire event if actions warrant it.
